Dr. Hassan Moinzadeh is a Paradigm Medical Director specializing in inpatient acute rehabilitation, musculoskeletal medicine, and pain management.

He was the medical director of the Long Beach Memorial Medical Center subacute rehabilitation unit for over fifteen years and also the hospitalist on the unit for patients with major multiple trauma, neurological disorders including acute brain injury and stroke, and post-operative pulmonary and cardiac conditions. In addition, he oversaw the inpatient opiate detox and outpatient biopsychosocial management of complex chronic pain cases as medical director of a pain management program.

Since 2000, Dr. Moinzadeh has also been an associate professor at University of California, Irvine, and is on staff at Long Beach Memorial. He is actively involved in the medical education of residents in Internal Medicine and PM&R. Dr. Moinzadeh has an outpatient practice in general rehabilitation, where he manages a diverse group of patients with chronic pain, SCI, TBI, amputation, and major multiple trauma.

Dr. Moinzadeh is a licensed clinical psychologist and has a private practice in Hollywood. He is a member of the American Academy of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, and has been a keynote speaker at Long Beach Memorial, Kaiser Permanente, Los Angeles County Psychological Association, UC Irvine, and numerous Workers' Compensation carriers on topics including Complex Regional Pain Syndrome, biopsychosocial approaches to Workers' Comp cases, post-trauma syndromes, and medical marijuana.

Since 2007, Dr. Moinzadeh has been a Paradigm Medical Director and has overseen the medical case management of complex pain patients and consulted extensively on catastrophic cases with significant psychological overlay, difficult medication management issues, and addiction.
